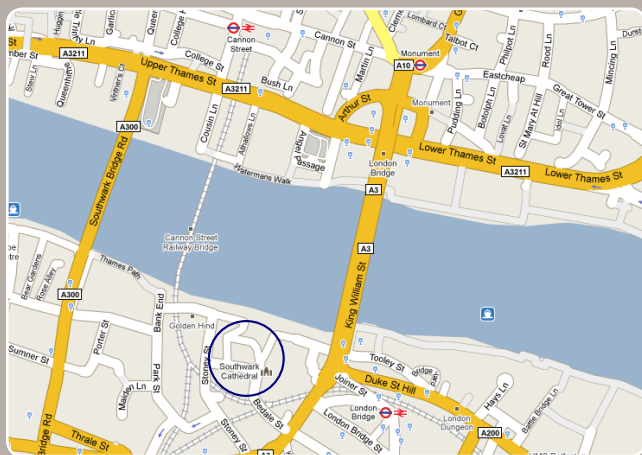

Workshop Leaders

Paul Bayes is National Mission and Evangelism Adviser. He believes passionately that that every churchgoer should be sharing in the Church's mission. He confesses that one of his ambitions via mission and evangelism is to leave the Church of England 'shaken and stirred'.

Edward Carter is a parish priest in Didcot and Area Dean of the Wallingford Deanery. He is also involved in teaching Christian Ethics at Ripon Cuddesdon. He has founded a project on collective worship in primary schools and has a forthcoming publication with BRF – Story Assemblies for the school year (expected early 2010).

Stephen Cottrell is the Bishop of Reading. He has worked in parishes in London and Chichester, as Pastor of Peterborough Cathedral, as Missioner in the Wakefield diocese and as part of Springboard, the Archbishop's evangelism team. Among his recent books on evangelism and spirituality are From the Abundance of the Heart: catholic evangelism for all Christians (DLT 2006) and Do Nothing to Change your Life; discovering what happens when you stop (CHP 2007) and Hit the Ground Kneeling; seeing leadership differently (CHP 2008). He is married to Rebecca and they have three boys.

Andrew Davey is National Adviser on Community and Urban Affairs. He has been a parish priest in inner London, where he still lives and cycles. He is an honorary research fellow at Manchester University, where he is a tutor for the Doctor of Practical Theology programme.

Lucy Gardner is Tutor in Christian Doctrine at St Stephen's House, Oxford, and has experience of assisting groups to discuss theological themes and their practical implications in a wide variety of contexts.
