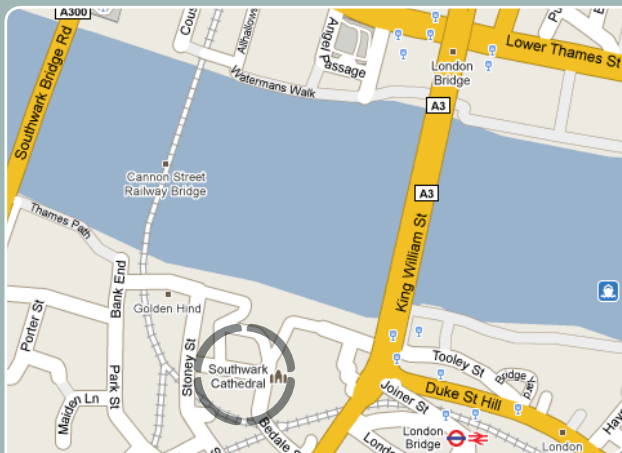

Workshop Leaders

Paula Gooder is a freelance writer and lecturer in Biblical Studies. Although her research areas are the writings of Paul the Apostle (with a particular focus on 2 Corinthians), New Testament Interpretation and the development of Ministry in the New Testament Period, she enjoys exploring the whole Bible. She is Canon Theologian of Birmingham and Guildford Cathedrals, Lay Canon at Salisbury Cathedral, Visiting Lecturer at King's College, London, Associate lecturer at St Mellitus College, London, Senior Research Scholar at the Queen's Foundation, Birmingham and Theological Adviser to the Bible Society. She is a Reader in the Church of England and a member of General Synod.

Mark Oakley is a Canon Residentiary and Treasurer of St Paul's Cathedral. He is the author of *The Collage of God*, has edited anthologies and published various articles and essays. He regularly broadcasts and reviews for the Church Times and other journals. Originally from Shrewsbury, he has served in London parishes and was for a while the Archdeacon of Germany and Northern Europe, based in Copenhagen.

Janette O'Neill is General Secretary/Chief Executive of USPG: Anglicans in World Mission. She has worked for Save the Children Fund (UK), the Anglican Church in Lesotho and Episcopal Relief & Development, working to set policy and devise strategy for HIV and AIDs programming in Africa and spearheading a policy for capacity-building and transformational development at provincial and national level. She also designed the first phase of the agency's NetsforLife malaria-control program. Most recently, she has been responsible for the development of an integrated strategy for Episcopal Relief & Development in post-conflict and fragile states, including Democratic Republic of Congo, Sudan and Liberia.

Mark Russell is Chief Executive of Church Army. After working in industry he served as a Youth Pastor. He developed a creative schools ministry and was a member of the Methodist Conference. He helped develop ONEder, a forerunner fresh expression of church. (continued over...)
